NB: Such growth during adolescence makes us unique.

This is an increase in size, weight and height of individual.

# **Development**

This is an increase in the quality of the body, mind and behaviour of an individual.

# Penalties God gave to the snake (Serpent)

# HIV/AIDS AS A FORM AND CAUSE OF SUFFERING IN CHRISTIANS

HIV stands for Human Immune Virus

This is the virus which attacked and weakens the immune system.

#### **AIDS** stands for **A**cquired **I**mmune **D**eficiency **S**yndrome

- ✓ **Acquired** means got from outside the body
- ✓ **Immune** means protected against or safe from disease, the body is always protected by white blood cells.
- ✓ **Deficiency** means lack or shortage or AIDS virus destroys white blood cells and the immune system becomes weak.
- ✓ **Syndromes** mean a collection or group of diseases and signs which show the presence of a disease.

NB: HIV/ AIDs is sexually transmitted disease which has caused suffering to both the victims and the community

AIDS is a pattern of disease symptoms which attach and destroy white blood cells leaving the body unprotected against infections.

#### **Causes of AIDS**

AIDS is caused by a virus called HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus) commonly called AIDS virus.

# Ways through which HIV virus is spread

- 1. Through playing unprotected sex with an infected person
- 2. Through mother to child transmission
- 3. Through blood transfusion with infected blood
- 4. Though sharing drug injection equipments
- 5. Through sharing sharp objects with an infected person.

# Body fluids can be exchanged in the following ways;

- 1. Sexual contacts with an infected person.
- 2. Blood transfusion from an infected person.
- 3. Sharing or using sharp cutting instruments
- 4. From an infected pregnant mother to her newly born baby at birth.
- 5. From the mother to the baby through breast feeding.

# Common practices which cannot spread AIDS virus

- 1. Normal holding or shaking of hands
- 2. Bites from mosquitoes and bed bugs
- 3. Caring for AIDS patients
- 4. Sharing cutlery and cooking utensils
- 5. Hugging or embracing AIDS patients
- 6. Coughing or sneezing
- 7. Cleaning, washing beddings and clothing of people with HIV/AIDS

#### Practices that may lead to HIV infection

- ✓ Circumcision
- ✓ Skin tattooing
- ✓ Sharing wives in some communities especially in Eastern Uganda

# Signs and symptoms of HIV/AIDS The major signs of HIV/AIDS

- a) Herpes zoster locally called "Kisipi" which inflames the skin making it appear as scalded.
- b) Chronic diarrhoea which may last for more than a week
- c) Sudden loss of about 10% of the normal body weight.
- d) Skin cancer which is also called Kaposis scarcomer, it causes itching and leads to scratching that leaves black spots.
- e) Swollen lymph glands especially those of the neck and armpits

- f) Oral thrush where by the tongue, gums, lips, and inside of the mouth plus the alimentary canal
- g) Chronic cough which lasts long.

# Symptoms of HIV/ AIDS

- 1. Tiredness without any proper cause
- 2. General body weakness
- 3. Persistent fever which is on and off
- 4. Loss of appetite

# People who are at risk of getting HIV/AIDS

- a) Sexually active people between the ages of 15-45years
- b) Rape and defilement victims
- c) Long distant truck drivers and traders who often have casual sex when away from their married partners for a long time.
- d) Prostitutes who sell themselves for sex to many partners.
- e) Bar attendants.

# (a). To an individual victim

- 7. It has led to poverty since the drugs are very expensive.

- 9. Reduced chances to give birth to healthy children
- 10. Loss of faith in God

# (b). To the community

- 1. Financial problem arising from looking after a sick person
- 2. Increased orphans
- 3. Worries by family members and friends
- 4. Failure to participate in community events especially the person fell sick
- 5. Loss of man power at place of work and at home

#### **Effects of AIDS/HIV**

These are many effects of HIV/AIDS on infected person, family and community.

- a) They suffer personal pain from the disease.
- b) It leads to loss of jobs.
- c) The family spends a lot of money on treatment, care and feeding.
- d) They are stigmatized or isolated in the society.
- e) Loss of family income if the bread winner dies.
- f) Many children are orphaned and become child parents.

# Prevention and control of HIV/AIDS

There is currently no cure against AIDS, so people need to guard themselves against the disease by;

1. ABC approach

- 2. Having one faithful sexual partner
- 3. Abstain from sexual intercourse until marriage
- 4. Avoid practices which involve risks of getting AIDS like tattooing, ear piercing.
- 5. Use of condoms during sex.
- 6. Screening blood before marriage and transfusion
- 7. Sterilizing medical instruments.
- 8. Disposing syringes and needles after use.

# How we can manage AIDS patients

- a) People with AIDS need support in many ways.
- b) Eating a balanced diet.
- c) Join good social groups to relax and avoid heavy work.
- d) Should give up bad habits like smoking and drinking alcohol

- 2. Teenage mothers depend on their parents to bring up the baby
- 3. Early pregnancy many damage the reproductive system of a girl
- 4. Poor feeding may lead to malnutrition of both the mother and baby
- 5. Pre-mature birth put the lives of both the mother and child in danger
- 6. Caesarean birth that often happens makes the young mother go through a lot of pain
- 7. It may lead to school dropout
- 8. Lower educational levels
- 9. Production of premature babies
- 10. It leads to developmental disabilities in children
- 11. It leads to increase of child mortality
- 12. Unmarried adolescents experience rejection and stigma byparents and peers.
- 13. It leads to unsafe abortion

He was born in Heron and fathered by Terah.

#### How did Abraham show his faith to God?

- ✓ He accepted to change his name from Abram to Abraham and his wife's name from Sarai to Sarah

- ✓ Abraham means the father of all believers while Sarah means the mother of all believers.
- ✓ He accepted to produce a son at an old age
- ✓ He accepted to sacrifice his son (Isaac)
- ✓ He accepted circumcision at an old age.
- ✓ God made a covenant with Abraham.

Jeremiah foretold the destruction of Jerusalem and the exile of the Israelites.

This is the reason why he is referred to as the **prophet of doom**.


## **Baptism**

- ✓ It is an accession when a person becomes a member of a church of God's family.
- ✓ People are baptized in the Trinity.
- ✓ People are dipped in water or sprinkled with water drops by a priest or pastor.

# **Baptism of Jesus Christ**



Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist on river Jordan.

#### Confirmation

This is a sacrament that strengthens one's relationship with God

- ✓ Confirmation is the second sacrament that confirms baptized person.
- ✓ It is a sacrament which entrusts a Christian into the power of the Holy Spirit
- ✓ Its visible symbol is laying hands on the person being confirmed.

It is done by a Bishop

# Importance of confirmation

- 1. Strengthens a person's faith in God.
- 2. Makes one a full member of the church
- 3. It keeps the gift of the Holy Spirit active within an individual.
- 4. It enables one to live firmly as a Christian.
- 5. It enables the Christian to do what Jesus requires.

# Holy communion/Eucharist

The word Eucharist comes from a Greek word "Eucharistein" referring to Jewish blessings during meals. Jews recalled God's works of creation, salvation and holiness.

## **Holy Communion**

Holy Communion is a sacrament carried out in memory of Jesus' blood and body.

The sacrament of Holy Communion is done in remembrance of an event that took place at the last supper by our Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus was with all the 12 disciples with Him celebrating the Passover meal.

NB: Holy Communion reminds Christians about the last supper which was made on Holy Thursday

# **Symbols of Holy Communion**

- Wine symbolizes Jesus' blood
- Bread symbolizes Jesus' body

# The need for the Holy Communion

- A sacrifice
- The completer of Christian initiation
- A source of Christian life

The Ten Commandments were written on two stone tablets and kept in rectangular box and kept in a place of worship called **tabernacle**.


# The Ten Commandments and their meaning to Christians

- 4. Observe the Sabbath and keep it holy
- 5. Respect your father and mother
- 6. Do not commit murder
- 7. Do not commit adultery
- 8. Do not steal
- 9. Do not accuse anyone falsely
- 10. Do not desire another man's wife, house, land, slaves, and cattle



NB: The above commandments were given to guide people

# vii) Universal Adult suffrage

This is an election where all voters in an area are allowed to participate.

## Biblical teaching on purity according to New - Testament

(Matth 5: 13-48 fulfillment of the old covenant)

- ✓ Killing and anger that can lead to murder is forbidden
- ✓ Adultery is forbidden and prohibited.
- ✓ Divorce was allowed but whoever re-marries when the partner is still alive commits adultery
- ✓ It was forbidden to take false **taths** but swearing itself is wrong –simply say "Yes" or "Not"
- ✓ You were taught to pay an eye and tit for tat.

# BIBLE TEACHINGS ABOUT LIFE AND DEATH LIFE

- According to the Bible, life is useless if one does not live in light of Christ (Ecc. 1:2)
- ✓ In Ecclesiastes 1:3, life is full of working laboring and you have nothing to show for it.
- ✓ It is therefore important for us to look critically on how we spend life before we die.

#### DEATH

Death is the separation of man's spirit from his body and of man from God.

Death is not the end of a Christian.

It is just a passage to the everlasting life.

#### Types of death

- Spiritual death

Physical death is the separation of soul from the body.

Spiritual death is the separation of man's spirit from his body.

(James 2:26 "the body without spirit is dead already"

The first person to die was Abel (The son of Adam and Eve) He was killed by his brother Cain. His death marked the first murder in the Bible.

(Ecclesiastes 12:7 says' then shall the dust return to the earth as it was; the spirit shall go to God who have it and the soul no longer exist"

# Biblical teaching about life and death (John 11: 1-44, 11:25-27)

Jesus encourages us not to fear death because he has power over it.

"I am the way, the resurrection and life those who believe in me will live even though they die and all those who live and believe in me will never die" (John 11:25 - 26).

## Lesson we learn from the above text

- 1. There is life after death
- 2. God is more power full than death
- 3. In Christ, people overcome death
- 4. The dead shall resurrect one day
- 5. Jesus' mission is to set every one free
- 6. Jesus is the resurrection

# NOTE:

Christian leaders in the Bible encourage believers to have hope in life after death. When a Christian dies, it is like being a sleep till the Lord resurrects him/her to life.

Heaven is a place where the righteous people will go after death to meet God.

# The Christians' view about heaven

- ✓ Christians believe that heaven is a place where Christians will meet face to face with their God.
- ✓ Christians also believe that heaven is a place where all believers will meet in a gathering called the wedding feast of the lamb (Rev 21:27)
- ✓ Christians believe that heaven is a place where believers will be rewarded for all their good deeds, i.e. heaven itself will be a reward for righteous people while sinners will go to hell.

✓ Christians believe that heaven is a place where they will have full expression of eternal life in union with God the father.

# Physical suffering

This is the suffering which affects our bodies like eyes, legs, arms, internal body organs

# Causes of physical suffering

- 1. Beatings
- 2. Accidents
- 3. Torture

## **Emotional suffering**

Emotional suffering is the suffering which rises from one's mind

# Causes of emotional suffering

- 1. Misunderstandings

- ✓ Its offspring and those of the woman became enemies.

# Woman (Eve)

- ✓ To have trouble during pregnancy.
- ✓ To have pain during child bearing.
- ✓ To be subject to man
- ✓ Her offspring and those of the snake to be enemies.

#### Man (Adam)

- ✓ To work hard in order to get food.
