





The doctors and nurses in Bulamu Hospital are highly trained. They treated our brother very well. He was discharged just after a month.


After discharging him, the doctors came to our home to teach us how we can prevent such accidents both at home and at school. They also taught us about the first aid for victims of burns and scalds.

These elections are organized by the school electoral commission. In our school, the commission organized a free and fair elections. Before the polling day, the school electoral commission pinned the lists of candidates who had shown interest in different posts advertised. The posts included; the head prefect, head boy, head girl academic prefect, sanitation prefect, time keeper etc.

The most competitive post of all, was the post of Games and Sports. This is because it had more and capable contestants. Ainembabazi Isaiah Kevin P3, who overwhelmingly won changed his walking style.

His parents felt so happy that they <u>purchased</u> sweets, pan-cakes and buns to appreciate his <u>electorate</u>. On the polling day, the head teacher Mr. Onguti Joseph, was there to ensure that there was no vote rigging. All the electoral materials like ballot papers, ballot boxes, aprons, pens, basins and indelible ink were in place. The polling stations were manned by the presiding officer and polling assistants.

The chairperson Electoral Commission, Mr. Tumushabe Joseph, announced the results. All candidates who had won the election started celebrating while the

ones who had lost could not help weeping. He later advised both the winners and losers that life does not end at that.

He advised them to work harder and co-operate to create harmony and form formidable leaders in the school. He said that there were no forms of malpractice like voter bribery, vote rigging and impersonation identified whatsoever. Since there were so many invalid votes cast, the electoral observers said the commission had not dully carried out civil education.

At the end of the day, all the pupils had understood the values of conducting free and fair election. They had also learnt values of living together harmoniously regardless of our difference in thoughts and ideologies.
