

- √ Karamoja had hostile tribes// The people of Karamoja were hostile.
- √ The British were not interested in the dry areas of Karamoja
- 8. How did the formation of political parties help the people of Uganda to gain independence?
 - ✓ Political parties helped to promote unity among people/Political parties mobilized people to demand for their independence//Political parties helped to sensitize people about their rights
- 9. Why doesn't Uganda experience a true Equatorial climate and yet it is crossed by the Equator?
 - ✓ Due to Uganda's high altitude which helps to reduce the high temperatures
 - ✓ Uganda lies at a relatively high altitude which reduces temperatures
- 10. Name any **one** king of Buganda who died in exile.
 - √ Kabaka Mwanga II // Kabaka Muteesa II
- 11. Why is convectional rainfall usually received in the afternoon hours?
 - ✓ There is high evaporation and transpiration rate during afternoon hours
 - ✓ Due to expansion and contraction of air // Due to high rates of evaporation/transpiration during afternoon hours caused by heat.
- 12. How is population explosion different from population growth?
 - ✓ Population explosion is the rapid/sudden increase in the number of people living in an area while population growth is the gradual increase in the number of people living in an area.
- 13. Mention any **one** practice that can promote economic development in the community
 - √ Hard work among people//Teamwork//Cooperation among people//Unity among people/Regular saving etc
- 14. Why is the Resident District Commissioner (RDC) considered a political leader?
 - ✓ He/she is a political appointee who represents the president and the ruling party at the
 district level
 - ✓ He/she serves the interests of the president//They are responsible for the political mobilization of the population for government programs
 - √ He/she chairs the district security committee.
 - ✓ He/she carries out political oversight on behalf of the central government.
 - **NB:** RDCs/RCCs though classified constitutionally as "Senior Civil Servants", their current functions are largely political in nature with the mandate to uphold the ruling political party's ideology.
- 15. Why is trespassing a major cause of conflicts between a school and its neighbours?
 - ✓ Trespassing leads to destruction of property of the school or community.
 - ✓ It causes /poses safety risks to both parties
 - ✓ It may lead to encroachment on boundaries/land of the either party.

- It is expensive to construct winding roads//Hard rocks causes break down of construction equipment/machines//Steep slopes prevent easy movement of tractors/graders //Steep slopes leads to accidents during construction//Much fuel is

OR: Name the pillar of Islam that enables Muslims to share their wealth with the poor.




