### **ENVIRONMENTAL DEGRADATION**

Environment is man and his surroundings. It is made up of fauna and flora, both macro and micro. Fauna are the animals while flora are the plants. The dual need to be protected. But man has gone further to destroy the environment.

The environment has been destroyed by human activities such as deforestation. This is the cutting down of trees on a large scale without replacement. Man cuts trees for timber, farming and to get wood fuel. Logs of trees are burnt for charcoal, and the smoke produced pollutes the environment. When this smoke is released into the atmosphere, it destroys the Ozone layer which helps to protect the earth against harmful radiation from the sun.

The other human activity is swamp drainage. This is the clearing away of water from swamps for human activities such as setting up human settlements, animal farms, roads and railways, and perhaps growing crops like sugarcane, yams, among others. This act can easily culminate into floods since swamps are water collecting centres. The swamps also help in rising evaporation rates, henceforth increasing chances of rainfall formation.

So, humans are likely to experience drought if swamps are not protected.

Lastly, environment has also been destroyed through bush burning which causes soil infertility. It leaves the land or soil bare exposing it to the agents of soil erosion. It also leads to death of the fauna living in the soil, for example earthworms which aerate the soil.

Nevertheless, we can conserve the environment through the following ways. First of all, we should practice afforestation and re- afforestation. These trees will help in rain formation and thus beautifying the environment and thereafter reduce climatic hazards. Rain will be enough for farmers to plant their crops.

We ought to terrace the land, avoid overgrazing and over cultivation so as to control soil erosion and enable land to regain its stature. Here, the children of our children will rejoice in the works of their fore fathers.

In a nutshell therefore, it is everyone"s duty to protect and conserve the environment in which we live.


