RADIO AND TELEVISION IN UGANDA

Radio and television are <u>essential</u> forms of communication in Uganda, with many stations operating across the country. Radio is the most widely used medium especially in rural areas due to its affordability and use of local languages. Some popular radio stations in Uganda include; Radio Simba, Capital FM, CBS FM, Radio West to mention but a few.

Television is more common in urban areas than in rural areas due to easy accessibility to electricity and good infrastructures. Major television stations in Uganda include; NTV Uganda, UBC TV, NBS TV, Galaxy TV, etc. They provide a range of news, entertainment and educational programmes. These media outlet play an important role in national development and public awareness. For instance, during elections, stations such as NTV Uganda and NBS host political debates and voter education programs. During the COVID-19 pandemic, both radio and television were used by the Ministry of Health to spread safety guidelines and health messages.

Additionally, cultural contents including storytelling and traditional music are broadcast on stations like Bukedde TV and CBS Radio helping to promote and <u>preserve</u> Ugandan heritage.

Despite their impact, radio and television stations in Uganda face challenges like limited funding, political pressure and access issues in some remote areas.

Conclusively, radio and television continue to be powerful tools for information, education and cultural preservation in Uganda.
