Item 3

A report from the forest rangers shows that there are two types of wild rabbits living in Budongo Forest Park. Some have white fur while others have brown fur. These rabbits live on the dark forest floor containing a thick vegetation cover. Both types of rabbits are fed on by the same predators which also live in the same forest. On several occasions, the rangers observed that matings between white and brown rabbits have always produced brown offspring. As time went by, rangers noticed that the forest had become dominated with brown rabbits.

Item 4

Lawrence cleared a thick vegetation cover and large trees along the slope of a mountain where many animals lived and he planted millet. During the rainy season, the mountain received heavy rains that caused large amounts of top soils to run down into the wetlands, that later become flooded with muddy water. Around this time, wild animals attacked surrounding communities and cases of malaria were high. Lawrence had a poor yield of millet at the end of the season.

Task

- (a) Explain how Lawrence's farming activities caused the ecological challenges described in the scenario and suggest ways they can be addressed.
- (b) Why is it important for Lawrence to conserve the environment within the community he lives.

Item 5

A mountainous area that was once covered with medicinal plant species has recently been taken over by mining activities. During the start of the operations, the natural vegetation was cleared. The mining process released dust into the air, caused frequent waste runoff into nearby swamps and produced loud noise and ground vibrations. Additionally, the machines used in metal extraction emitted toxic fumes into the air. As a result, several environmental problems developed in the area.

Task

- (a) Explain how the mining activities caused the environmental problems in the area and suggest ways these problems can be reduced.
- (b) Explain why it was necessary to conserve the environment during the mining activities.

Item 6

Joseph, an obese student, registered to participate in the upcoming district athletic competitions. To increase his chances of winning the competitions, Joseph was advised to reduce his weight. Therefore, he started taking dietary weight loss pills regularly in order to lose weight quickly before the training began. After a few days, Joseph began experiencing unusual changes in his body that included, a dry mouth, frequent urination and an intense feeling of body heat. These symptoms forced him to go for a medical check-up. The doctor explained that the weight loss pills had reduced his gut's ability to digest carbohydrates properly. As a result, Joseph was advised to withdraw from the competitions.

Task

- (a) Explain how the weight loss pills caused the changes that occurred in Joseph's body.
- (b) Why was Joseph advised to withdraw from participating in the competition?

Item 7

Samuel, an adult, has been feeding on a salt-rich diet that was deficient in Iron for a period of two years and he only takes one liter of water a day. Recently, he started experiencing certain symptoms that caused him to go for a medical check-up at a health Centre IV. The doctor explained to Samuel that he had developed high blood pressure, anaemia and kidney malfunctioning. In addition, doctors emphasized that these health problems were caused by Samuel's life styles but he did not accept.

(Hint: The recommended adult daily water intake is 3 litres)

Task

- (a) Using your biological knowledge, convince Samuel to accept the doctors' findings.
- (b) Advice Samuel on how to solve his health challenges.
